Annual Delta Lake State Park Club Hunt and Picnic

The annual Earth Club Treasure Hunt and Picnic was once again a smashing success at Delta Lake State Park on September 8, 2019! The weather was absolutely perfect for metal detecting. Volunteers for set up arrived at 8:00AM and we were ready to roll for the day's activities by 9:00AM. Our first hunt, called the money hunt kicked off on schedule with XX hunters. Several dozen plastic tubes were buried



with fake currency and a penny inside.



These bills were redeemable for actual dollars that you can spend. Members could find denominations of \$1, \$5, \$10, \$20 and \$50. The finder of the \$50 bill was **Ira Tisch**. In addition, three metal disks were planted that were each redeemed for a Flying Eagle Cent. The lucky finders were **Lori Fealy**, **Dave Dittler** and **John Bradlinski**.

The second hunt of the day was the silver/token hunt. Several hundred targets were buried including \$500 worth of U.S. silver coins, tokens and coins from countries all around the world. To mix it up a little bit, numerous jewelry items were buried along with a dozen or so tootsie toy cars. Three disks were also buried that were redeemable for a Three Cent Nickel. **Mike Eychner, Dave**

After a break for lunch of burgers, dogs and member "dishes to pass", we moved on to speed hunt. Similar to prior years, hundreds of painted memorial pennies were seeded

throughout the beach area. The winner was the member who could find the most of these pennies in a 30 minute time frame. **Dave Dittler** found the most at 41 and was awarded a set of

Headphones. Matt Lenhart was right behind him in second place



with 39 pennies found (heavy duty digger) and third place went to **Brandon Snyder** (1 year subscription to American Digger Magazine).

The final hunt was the "Key" hunt. Several hundred keys were buried on the beach, only one of which would open the locked treasure box. The treasure box was loaded with numerous goodies including silver coins, jewelry, a digger from Garret, a Whites T-Shirt, a Silver Round and a Morgan Dollar. Lori Fealy was the finder of the winning key. Two other keys were also pre-designated winners with prizes awarded from the raffle table, one to Margaret Ferjet and the other to Matt Lenhart.

Club Hunt Scheduled for October Larry Ehlinger

I have secured permission for our club to hunt the Delta Lake Bible Conference Center located about 7 miles north of downtown Rome just off of Route 26. Heading North it's located on the right side of the highway and there is a large sign at the entrance. Look for a large "A" framed church located near the entrance.

The center was built in 1924 and has hosted 100s of Christian youth and adult groups in its nearly 100 years of existence. The sprawling complex has many large buildings, private camps, athletic fields, grassy areas, a swimming area (although no beach) and private residences'. Much of the area may be searched but there will be several areas that will be off limits, these will be marked.

There are a few stipulations we need to adhere too. Because of the conference Centers long history there is a possibility we may find objects that should, and will be turned over to the Executive Director, Steve Clark. If any of us find a valuable, or personal object that can be traced back to the owner it must be turned in.

Everyone who hunts needs to have his or her club dues paid. Everyone needs to sign in upon arrival. Everyone needs to make recoveries on your knees, use a ground cloth and a small hand trowel or digger. However, if you have a physical issue where you can't easily get up or down and can only make recoveries standing using a long-handle shovel an exception can be made.

The date for the hunt will be Saturday October 19th rain or shine. This hunt will be for this day only. You may show up anytime you'd like but not before 9:00am. 


